

I found this book to be slightly amusing at best. The author wrote this book in a "girlfriend" tone and often used such words as "nigga" to describe African American men. The main character, Candice, reminded the reader of how "fine" she was continuously and after the first few chapters her character became about as predictable as a monkey eating a bucket of bananas that has been placed in front of him.
